Council Chambers, Peoria, Illinois, September 25, 2001, a Regular Meeting of the City Council was held this date at 6:18 P.M., at City Hall, 419 Fulton Street, Mayor David P. Ransburg presiding.

**ROLL CALL**

Roll call showed the following Council Members present: Ardis, Grayeb, Gulley, Morris, Nichting, Sandberg, Teplitz, Thetford, Turner, Mayor Ransburg – 10; Absent: Spears – 1.

**INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Mayor Ransburg discussed the recent and tragic death of Police Officer Jim Faulkner, who was shot and killed in the line of duty on September 20, 2001. He said there was strong Council support of a major effort for a multi-faceted program to go after people who were evil, who ran illegitimate businesses, and who came to the City of Peoria to do bad things. He said the City Officials, Council, citizens and City employees were appalled at recent violent criminal activity. He said this City would never forget the family of Officer Faulkner and he asked those in the Council Chambers, as well as those viewing the Council Meeting in their homes, or listening by radio, to remember Officer Faulkner's wife and five children in a moment of silent prayer. Mayor Ransburg then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk Mary Haynes distributed a copy of this communication to all members of the City Council.

Council Member Nichting moved to grant Privilege of the Floor to Detective Mike Doyle; seconded by Council Member Turner.

Hearing no objections, Mayor Ransburg granted Privilege of the Floor to Detective Mike Doyle.

Detective Mike Doyle, President of the Peoria Police Benevolent Association, thanked those in the community for the outpouring of donations and support to the Police Department and the family of Police Officer Jim Faulkner. He introduced the Chairman of the September 29<sup>th</sup> Fundraiser, Officer Phil Fisher, and explained the philosophy of the event.

Officer Phil Fisher explained Police Officers and Fire Fighters from Peoria and outlying communities, and their families, would be collecting donations at more than eighteen shopping centers in the Peoria area and outlying communities. He said the donations would be a gift that would go directly to Mrs. Faulkner and the children. He thanked those who had already donated their time and money for this cause.

Council Member Nichting moved to grant permission for the Peoria Police Benevolent Association to collect donations on the sidewalks of Peoria on Saturday, September 29, 2001, from 10:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M., and extend authorization for any other date in the future which would be appropriate (open), for the Faulkner Family; seconded by Council Member Teplitz.

**(01-651) REQUEST by Council Member Grayeb for Citizens to Contact the President of AES Corporation, Parent Company of CILCO, to Regain Local Control of their Energy Future.**

Council Member Grayeb expressed concern that AES Corporation, the parent company of CILCO, was in the process of dismantling the profit centers of CILCO and selling off portions to foil the City's efforts to gain local control of the community's energy future. He explained many regulatory hurdles would need to be met and many permissions for transfer of assets must be given by the Illinois Commerce Commission before AES could succeed in their efforts. He said any restructuring must be approved, but the deal makers had already met a solid rock of resistance from the leadership of this community, as well as other surrounding communities. He said the local goal was for price stability, a dramatic increase in service levels, and to regain corporate community leadership, commitment, and involvement in the communities. He urged concerned citizens to fax or write Mr. Dennis Bakke, President of AES Corporation, 1001 N. 19<sup>th</sup> Street, Arlington, Virginia 22209, Fax 703-528-4510, to let him know that citizens were demanding him to be true to his own words by leaving a legacy to this community by letting local citizens and investors regain control of its energy future. He added that only local control would be acceptable.

Mayor Ransburg said he spoke with the Mayor of Pekin, who was the President of the Heartland Illinois Mayors Association, and he would be holding a meeting with other Mayors to discuss the adoption of a Resolution by each community.

**CITIZEN REQUESTS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL**

Hearing no objections, Mayor Ransburg granted Privilege of the floor to those who wished to address the Council.

Mr. Bill O'Brien, 3321 N. Chestnut Lane, spoke in support of local ownership of CILCO. He expressed concern about how CILCO's parent company, AES, was attempting to dismantle the company. He urged the Council to take an active role in mobilizing the community to keep ownership of CILCO local and to protect the community.
