

LEGAL NOTICE

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT NOTICE

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Peoria has ordered that WEST RIDGE ROAD, in the Northeast Quarter of Section 29 in Richwoods Township shall be improved by resurfacing the existing pavement with bituminous concrete having a thickness of one and one half inches (1 1/2"); all existing curb and sidewalk will be removed and replaced with combination curb and sidewalk having a width of five and one-half feet (5.5'), including curb; all existing driveway approaches will be removed and replaced with PCC driveway pavement along the above-referenced roadway; existing entrance walks and driveways behind the sidewalks shall be removed and replaced for adjustment purposes only, as necessary. Additionally, a new ornamental street lighting system will be constructed. All disturbed areas will be restored with sod. All adjustments and appurtenances, other than stated and necessary for the construction of this improvement, shall be constructed as shown on the plans or as directed by the Engineer.

The ordinance for said improvement being on file in the Office of the City Clerk of said City, and the City of Peoria having applied to the Circuit Court of the Tenth Judicial Circuit of Illinois, Peoria County, for an assessment of the cost of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment having been made and returned to said Court, for \$47.70 per front foot for a new city-standard ornamental street lighting system and combination curb and sidewalk, payable in ten (10) annual installments bearing interest at the rate of 3.25% per annum from the date of first voucher issued after work begins, and assessing the sum of \$634,104.44 as benefits upon the public, the final hearing thereon will be held on July 29, 2011, or as soon thereafter as the business of the Court will permit.

All persons desiring must file objections in said Court by **9:00 a.m. Friday, July 29, 2011**, before the date of final hearing and appear at the hearing and make their defense.
