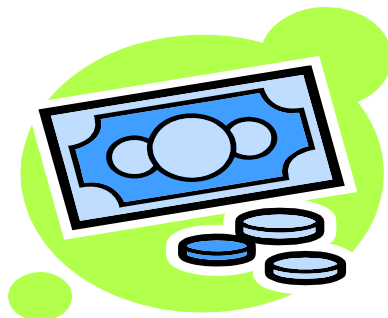
The Fire and Police Commission approve and place into effect the 2012 Eligibility Pool at their regular monthly meeting. You need not be present at this meeting.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS/REQUIREMENTS

1. Age: Must be 21 years of age by date of the written exam. You cannot have attained age 35 by date of entrance into the Eligibility Pool. (By State Statute, exceptions made for individuals with prior municipal fire experience.)
2. Education: Graduation from high school or GED equivalent minimum to apply; prefer applicants with Fire Science college courses or college degree in Fire Science or related field, and emergency medical technician certification.
3. Driver's License: Must possess a valid driver's license.
4. Record: Must agree to be fingerprinted and found not to have been convicted of a felony or certain misdemeanors as listed in Illinois State Statutes.
5. Vision: Applicants must meet minimum standards for vision and hearing. Please see 'Detailed Vision Standards' included in this brochure.
6. Residency: Applicants need not be City residents to apply. If hired, must establish permanent City residency within one year of hire date.
7. Physical Requirements: Must be able to perform the essential functions of the position and pass the physical agility exam.
8. Examinations: Must pass written and physical agility for placement into the Eligibility Pool; must pass background investigation, oral interview, polygraph, medical including a drug screen and psychological examinations prior to hire.

APPLICANT PROCEDURES

All persons interested in participating in the written and physical examinations **MUST** submit the following documents to the City of Peoria Human Resources Department **no later than Friday, April 20, 2012 at 5:00 p.m.**

1. **Employment application** -- Individuals, who already have a completed application on file for **this** testing period, need **not** submit a duplicate. Candidates who are currently in the City's Fire Eligibility Pool must submit a new application and resubmit all documents.
2. **Photocopy of Driver's License**
3. **Photocopy of Birth Certificate.** **NOTE:** This should be a copy of the registered (or certified) birth certificate, which is on file at the courthouse in the county of birth. The hospital certificate (with the footprints of the newborn) is not an acceptable document.
4. **Photocopy of High School Diploma or GED Certificate.** **NOTE:** You still need to submit a copy of your diploma/GED even if you have attended or graduated from a college or university.

Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT) Certification – If you have successfully completed the Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT), you will need to submit a copy of your CPAT Identification Card. The CPAT Identification Card must have been received within one year prior to the scheduled physical agility examination with the City of Peoria, **June 16, 2012**. With this CPAT Identification Card, you will be waived from taking the physical agility examination with the City of Peoria if you successfully pass the written examination.

A copy of your college diploma and/or transcripts and a photocopy of your DD214 Form (If you are a veteran of the U.S. Military) can be submitted at anytime during the process, if applicable.

THE HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING PHOTOCOPY SERVICES FOR YOUR ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS.

Applicants should notify the Human Resources Department immediately at (309) 494-8575 if there are any problems securing these documents or if there are any questions. **Failure to provide the required documents or submitting incomplete information by the deadline date will result in ineligibility to participate in the examination process.**

DETAILED VISION STANDARDS (MINIMUM) CITY OF PEORIA ENTRY LEVEL FIREFIGHTER

NOTE: If there is any doubt or question with regard to one's ability to pass these vision standards, please contact your ophthalmologist or optometrist. Candidates are subjected to these vision standards in the medical examination which occurs a few months prior to hire from the Eligibility Pool.

Far Visual Acuity

Far visual acuity less than 20/40 binocular, corrected with contact lenses or spectacles. Far visual acuity less than 20/100 binocular for wearers of hard contacts or spectacles, uncorrected. Far visual acuity worse than 20/40 binocular corrected with contact lens or spectacles, and far visual acuity uncorrected worse than 20/100 binocular for wearers of hard contacts or spectacles, compromises a member's ability to safely perform essential job tasks. Successful soft contact lens wearers are not subject to the uncorrected standard.

Monocular Vision

Stereopsis without fusional capacity, inadequate depth perception, or loss of peripheral vision (>110 degrees on confrontation) interferes with safe performance of essential job tasks.

Peripheral Vision

In the horizontal meridian of less than 100 degrees in the better eye or any condition that significantly affects peripheral vision in both eyes. **Physician Guidance:** New monocular vision requires a minimum of 6 months for depth perception accommodation in order to safely perform other essential job tasks.

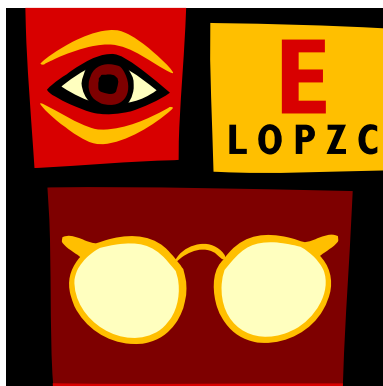
Pathology

An applicant shall be free from pathological conditions which would impair visual performance; and free from any severe active, chronic, or progressive disease of the eye such as retinal detachment, progressive retinopathy, or optic neuritis.

Ophthalmological Procedures:

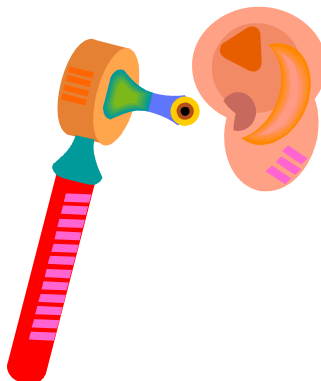
A sufficient amount of time must have passed after procedures such as radial keratotomy, Lasik procedure and repair of retinal detachment to allow for stabilization of visual acuity and to ensure that there are no post-surgical complications. Six months is the waiting period adopted. The Fire and Police Commission may require specific physical proficiency testing of an applicant's ability to perform the essential job functions upon the recommendation of the medical examiner.

NOTE: The City of Peoria does not require or endorse the use of Radial Keratotomy (RK) or other elective surgery to correct vision defects.



DETAILED HEARING STANDARDS (MINIMUM) CITY OF PEORIA ENTRY LEVEL FIREFIGHTER

1. Abnormal hearing requiring a hearing aid or impairing a member's ability to hear and understand the spoken voice under conditions of high background noise, or hear, recognize, and directionally locate cries or audible alarms, interferes with safe performance of essential job tasks.
2. Any condition causing chronic or recurring vertigo, ataxia, or other disturbance of gait and balance compromises a member's ability to safely perform essential job tasks.
3. Medical Conditions:
 - A. Chronic vertigo or impaired balance as demonstrated by the inability to tandem gait walk.
 - B. On audiometric testing, average hearing loss in the unaided better ear greater than 40 decibels (dB) at 500 Hz, 1000 Hz, and 2000 Hz when the audiometric device is calibrated to ANSI Z24.5.
 - C. Any ear condition (or hearing impairment) that results in a person not being able to safely perform essential job tasks.
 - D. Unequal hearing loss.
 - E. Average uncorrected hearing deficit at the test frequencies 500 Hz, 1000, Hz, and 3000 Hz greater than 40 dB in either ear.
 - F. Atresia, stenosis, or tumor of the auditory canal
 - G. External otitis
 - H. Agenesis or traumatic deformity of the auricle
 - I. Mastoiditis or surgical deformity of the mastoid
 - J. Meniere's syndrome, labyrinthitis, or tinnitus
 - K. Otitis media



DESCRIPTION OF WRITTEN AND PHYSICAL AGILITY EXAMINATIONS

There is no make-up date for these examinations.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION

The Written Examination is scheduled for **SATURDAY, JUNE 16, 2012.** No make-up date for this examination. Candidates should report to the test site prior to 8:45 a.m. on June 16, 2012, and expect to remain at the site for 4 to 4.5 hours. **Please Note: NO CANDIDATE WILL BE ADMITTED TO THE WRITTEN EXAM AFTER 9:00 A.M.; NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Candidates must bring one form of photo identification such as a driver's license to the test site for entry to the Examination.

The Written Examination may be a little different than some other tests you have taken. The exam covers a broad range of skills and abilities (competencies) that have been found to be important for the job. There are 4 competencies being measured on this test. They include **1. Basic Education Skills** (Reading, Writing, and Mathematics), **2. Practical Skills** (Problem Solving, Judgment & Common Sense, Accomplishing Goals, Thinking clearly, quickly & logically in complicated situations), **3. Interpersonal Skills** (working well with others, appreciating diverse groups of people, service attitude, teamwork & flexibility), and **4. Emotional Skills** (Integrity, Dependability, Initiative, Work Ethic, Self Control/Impulse Control, Capacity for Empathy, Respect for Authority).

There will be **Situational Questions**. These questions describe situations related to an event or subject and ask what you would do, what the person in the situation should do, or what you think about the situation. There will also be **Questions About You**. These are questions that ask how you feel or think about a specific topic, or that ask you to describe yourself in various ways.

The scores in the different components are combined into a Total Score to provide a final score and ranking for each applicant. Each applicant will have a maximum of 3 hours and 15 minutes to complete the exam. (Some applicants will finish early). The test is multiple choice and the questions are numbered sequentially. Exams will be graded on site by an independent testing source to determine the applicant's eligibility. Applicants who fail will be excused. Applicants who pass will be given a date and time to report for the Physical Agility Examination.

The Study Guides for the Written Examination will be mailed beginning the week of **April 23, 2012**, to all applicants who have submitted completed applications by that week and through the deadline date. The Study Guide is provided to help applicants prepare for the written test. The Study Guide does not contain information to memorize, but it does familiarize applicants with the content and format of the test. The Study Guide will also provide ideas for other study resources. Bring your study guide to the Orientation Session if you have any questions from the guide.

Please do not bring study material to the exam site.

CANDIDATE PHYSICAL ABILITY TEST (CPAT)

If you have successfully completed the Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT), you will need to submit a copy of your CPAT Identification Card. The CPAT Identification Card must have been received within one year prior to the scheduled physical agility examination with the City of Peoria, June 16, 2012. With this CPAT Identification Card, you will be waived from taking the physical agility examination with the City of Peoria if you successfully pass the written examination.

If you would like to complete the CPAT before the City of Peoria's testing process begins, there are two locations in Illinois that offer the test, which are as follows:

CPAT guidelines require that all candidates have the opportunity to attend the Pre-Test Preparation Program, which includes Orientations and Practice Tests Sessions. **Candidates are not required to participate in the Pre-Test Preparation Program prior to the CPAT Test, but it is strongly recommended.** Candidates who elect to bypass the Pre-Test Preparation Program must sign a written waiver form prior to attempting the CPAT Test. ***If the candidate successfully completes the CPAT Practice Test, then he/she is eligible to receive a CPAT Identification Card from NIPSTA.**

The CPAT schedule for NIPSTA, shown below, is available on a “first-come, first-served” basis. View website for more information. Applications for participation will be confirmed upon receipt of payment \$130, which includes orientation sessions, practice test sessions and CPAT test. The Southwest United Fire Districts Fire Training Academy (SUFD) serves the Chicago Metro area providing a full-service fire training academy and an in-service training program to member departments. Individuals may register and take part in CPAT Pre-Certification for use in fire department hiring processes. These candidates must declare the departments they are testing for during registration. Upon successful completion of the test a CPAT Identification Card will be issued to the candidate. Testing fees will be \$125.00 and payment is required at time of registration. Payment by check, money order or cash only. Registration fee is non-refundable after orientation session. Candidates who elect to sign waiver of participation in orientation period may challenge CPAT during Timed Course Practice test dates or CPAT Test Dates, registration fee is required prior to each test attempt. PHYSICAL AGILITY EXAMINATION CITY OF PEORIA

The Physical Agility Examination for the City of Peoria is scheduled for **Saturday, June 16, 2012, from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. (Only for those candidates that live more than 100 miles from Peoria.) and Sunday, June 17, 2012, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.** The other dates will be **Saturday, June 30, 2012, and Sunday, July 1, 2012, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. if another day is needed.** All Physical Agility Examinations will be held at the **Fire Training Academy, 7130 N. Galena Road, Peoria, Illinois, 61615.** Candidates who pass the Written Examination will be given a date and time to report for the Physical Agility Examination. Candidates should report 15 minutes prior to their scheduled time. Candidates should expect to remain at the examination site for approximately 1–1½ hours.

Candidates must bring one form of photo identification such as a driver's license to the test site for entry to the examination.

Although the physical agility exam itself takes only six minutes (or less) to complete, you should plan to be at the test site for as much as several hours to account for waiting time and receiving the instructions of the examination. Please wear shorts, a tee-shirt and gym shoes for the physical agility exam. A sample of the waiver form which applicants must sign before being allowed to participate in this test can be viewed in the City's Human Resources Department at City Hall, 419 Fulton Street, Room 302, Peoria, Illinois 61602.

APPLICANTS ARE ADVISED TO OBTAIN THE CONSENT OF THEIR PHYSICIAN BEFORE PARTICIPATING IN THE PHYSICAL AGILITY EXAM.

The physical agility Job Task Test was designed after an exhaustive job task analysis conducted by ARA/Human Factors, the country's leading authority on public safety job standards development. The test accurately reflects the physical demands of a number of fire suppression activities. You might think of the test as a "sample" of a number of fire ground tasks necessary to the safe and effective performance of firefighters. You should pace yourself as you move from test event to test event. However, firefighters need to move quickly, so it is advisable to perform the events as quickly as possible.

PRACTICE SESSIONS – CITY OF PEORIA PHYSICAL AGILITY EXAMINATION

The City offers a program designed to familiarize and help prepare applicants for the physical agility exam. There is no cost to applicants and participation is strictly voluntary. Participants will be allowed to perform each event of the actual physical agility test and be timed as a practice only. It is recommended that anyone applying for the position of Firefighter participate in the practice session.

To familiarize you with the test items, a complete description follows. The test has been specifically designed to only test for necessary firefighting physical capacities. It is strongly recommended that you attend any or all of the Physical Agility Practice Test sessions to familiarize yourself with the test. The sessions are **not mandatory** and are as follows at the Peoria Fire Training Academy 7130 N. Galena Road, Peoria, Illinois 61615:

Saturday, May 19, 2012, 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

Saturday, June 9, 2012, 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

Wednesday, June 13, 2012, 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.

NOTE: This program is not a requirement, nor does participation guarantee applicants will pass the test. Applicants are strongly cautioned to get a medical exam before participating in any physical program or examination.

FIVE EVENTS OF PHYSICAL AGILITY EXAMINATION

Each applicant will be fitted with a helmet, coat, weighted vest, ankle weights, and a backpack approximating the weight that firefighters routinely wear (52 pounds) while participating in fire suppression activities. The test is a timed event. You may rest at anytime during the performance of the test, however, the timer continues to run. **Six minutes is the cut-off time (failure).** You must complete each event in sequential order in six minutes or less to pass the physical agility examination. The events are as follows:

First Event: Stair Climb

You will pick up a 100-foot high-rise hose bundle weighing 45 – 60 pounds, place it on your shoulder and carry it to the top floor of the stairway. You may use the handrails to assist you on the way up. Taking more than one step at a time is allowed on the way up the stairs. Deposit the hose load on the floor where indicated. This completes the first event. Pace yourself up the stair climb. Individuals who attempt to complete this event too quickly frequently place themselves in extreme oxygen debt, find it difficult to recover, and thus reduce their performance on the events that follow.

Second Event: Hose Hoist

Using a hand-over hand pulling motion, hoist the donut roll (50 pounds) with the aide of a rope to the top floor of the drill tower. This completes the second test. Walk down the stairs, **touching each step**, and out the door to the next testing station.

Third Event: Forcible Entry

Using the 9-pound shot hammer provided, drive the metal sled of the Keiser Force machine a distance of five feet. Strike the end of the beam, contacting the surface as squarely as possible for maximum force transfer. Pay attention to the position of the beam in relation to the inseam of your foot – they should be on the same plane. Getting “ahead” of yourself will result in the point of impact at the handle of the Force machine as opposed to the head of the mallet. This event is complete when the leading edge of the sled is even with the tray. This completes the third event.

Fourth Event: Hose Advance

Walk the required distance of 140 feet to the next station. Grasp the end of the charged inch and half hose line and drag it 75 feet to the box where indicated. Crack the nozzle to show water and place it on the ground. This completes the fourth event.

Fifth Event: Victim Rescue

Walk 40 feet to the next station and grasp the 175-pound victim (dummy) around the chest and drag it 100 feet. Lock your fingers and hands and lift with your legs, rather than your back. This event is complete, and the test is finished, when the legs of the dummy cross the finish line.

CRITERIA FOR PASSING THE CITY OF PEORIA PHYSICAL AGILITY EXAM

1. Candidates must complete all events in or under the designated time. The cutoff time for passing the exam has been set at **Six Minutes or less.**
2. Candidates must complete all events in the specified amount of time in the required sequence or they fail the examination.
3. Upon completion of the test, candidates will be told their time and will be informed of their pass/fail status.

APPLICANTS ARE ADVISED TO OBTAIN THE CONSENT OF THEIR PHYSICIAN BEFORE PARTICIPATING IN THE CITY OF PEORIA PHYSICAL AGILITY EXAMINATION.

PRE-CONDITIONING PROGRAM

The Peoria Fire Department is also sponsoring an on-going physical conditioning program for individuals interested in participating in the City's Firefighter testing process. Many people underestimate the difficulty of this job-related test and are unable to successfully complete it. City Firefighters are on hand to give advice on techniques to improve performance on the test. Advice may be given for those who need to strengthen the upper body or enhance aerobic capacity. While a medical waiver is not required, it is always important to consult your personal physician before beginning any fitness program.

ORIENTATION / STUDY SESSION PROGRAM (Voluntary)

Attendance at the Orientation is **not mandatory**, however it is suggested that you attend to learn more about the Fire Department's goals and structure, hiring outlook, qualifications of a Firefighter and career opportunities with the department. The testing process will also be discussed in detail and staff from both the Fire and Human Resources Departments will be on hand to answer all your questions. If you decide to attend, you only need to attend one Orientation/Study Session.

FINAL PROCEDURES

Applicants who meet all of the minimum eligibility requirements and who pass the written and physical examinations will have their names placed in the Firefighter Eligibility Pool and will be eligible for hire for up to a two-year period. Candidates will also be required to participate in and pass a departmental interview and an extensive background investigation. A panel of the Fire and Police Commissioners will conduct an oral interview with candidates screened into the process after the departmental interview. Candidates selected for oral interviews will be notified by the Human Resources Department of the date and time of the oral interview, as required by the Fire and Police Commission. Those who pass the Commission oral interview and are selected for hire will be put in a rank ordered hiring pool. As positions become available, the candidate will then be required to undergo a polygraph examination, a psychological evaluation and a medical examination including a drug screen.

Initial Recruit Training:

Any individual who becomes employed as a Firefighter for the City of Peoria will attend in-house training which consists of six weeks of classroom and practical training covering the basics of firefighting. Training is conducted at the Peoria Fire Training Academy, from 7am to 4pm, Monday through Friday. Those not already Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) must complete an additional EMT certification course. The training consists of physical training, including running, carrying heavy objects, chopping wood, and climbing stairs. Classroom training is demanding requiring passing grades on end-of-week written tests and at the end of recruit training, passing the State of Illinois standard for Firefighter II.

Continuing Education:

To earn promotions during your career, you must attend fire science classes (mostly conducted at Illinois Central College [ICC]) and earn state certifications. Some of the classes and certifications you will need during your career are: Firefighter III certification, Fire Apparatus Engineer, Fire Officer I and II, and Hazardous Materials First Responder. The City pays the tuition for fire science classes, although employees are individually responsible for registering.



PEORIA FIRE DEPARTMENT MISSION STATEMENT
